The clinic was just opened for the students and staff of the school. However, I am told that even with its present inadequacies, it has been compelled to add the pupils and staff of the primary school to its remit. It has two beds for males and three for females. There is no permanent doctor assigned to it, just medical officers rotated from the former school hospital.

The medical superintendent is Dr Aglobitse and he is eagerly waiting for whatever we can help him with. He and the chief matron gave me the list attached but he is welcome to other means of assistance and hopefully Nestle will help with the purchase of a clinic vehicle in the future as they hinted at our 30th anniversary funfair.

An appeal has also been made directly to us by the executive board of the OAA to assist the school with an emergency donation of GHC 2,000.00 to accelerate the building of the fence-wall around the school's (remaining) property. I'm told President Mills has promised to help with the issue of the continuing loss of school lands and also to look carefully at the request for autonomy by Achimota and some other schools!

Once again, I would like to thank everyone for entrusting me with the stewardship of this association for almost 10 years. I have formally announced at an earlier group meeting that after the presentation, polls will open for new executive officers in Ghana. My record covers events like the 25th anniversary school bonfire and barbecue, renovation of the general admin offices and the rehabilitation of the junior chemistry lab, the donation of a best house cup, of stronger files for the Aggrey Chapel Choir, representing the group at various OAA meetings and OAA80 events, presenting furniture purchased by the members outside to the school and a host of smaller duties. All this was a group effort by a fantastic dedicated core membership both in Ghana and outside and my personal congratulations goes out to them all. We pledge our support to our successors and ask for the blessings of the almighty on us all. We would also like to say a prayer for all the mates we have had to say farewell to.
